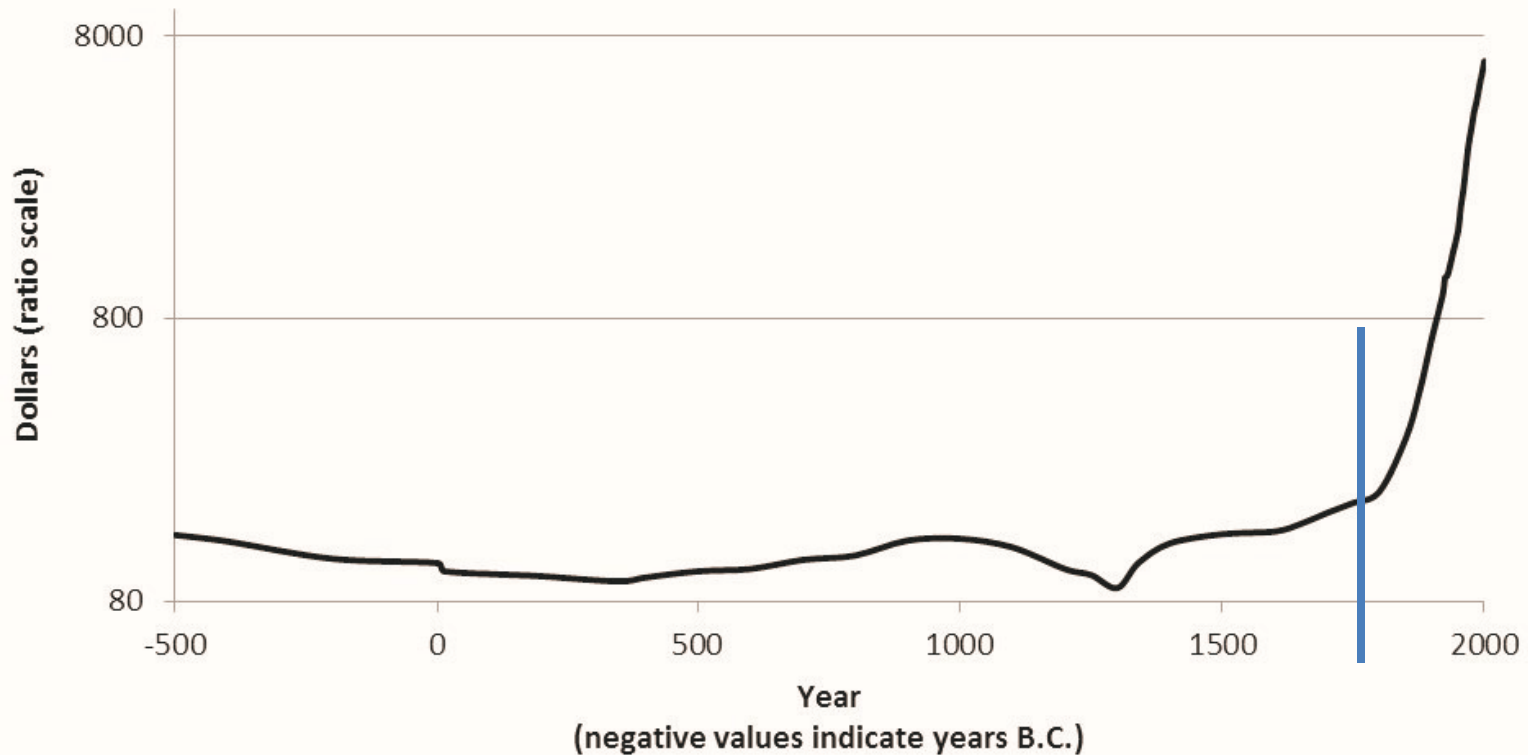
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Man's "natural" condition

“The Heartland Institute offers a model of what the EPA red team might look like. Their contrarian Nongovernmental International Panel on Climate Change — often referred to as a red team — publishes regular volumes of a report called *Climate Change Reconsidered*.”

Survey Data Proves It

- **82%** of the state elected officials surveyed read one or more Heartland newspapers “sometimes” or “always.”
- **79%** of the state elected officials surveyed recognize Heartland.
- **45%** of state elected officials reported a Heartland newspapers “influenced my opinion or led to a change in public policy.”
- **43%** of state elected officials surveyed consider Heartland to be a “very” or “somewhat” valuable source of information.

Bipartisan Appeal

- **Not only Republicans:** 78 percent of Democratic state legislators recognize The Heartland Institute, 77 percent read one or more Heartland newspapers “sometimes” or “always,” and 33 percent reported a Heartland newspaper “changed my opinion or led to a change in public policy.”
- **Heartland outperforms** three of the four benchmarked conservative and liberal think tanks in the survey in terms of being a valuable source of information and being used to help change opinions of colleagues or constituents.

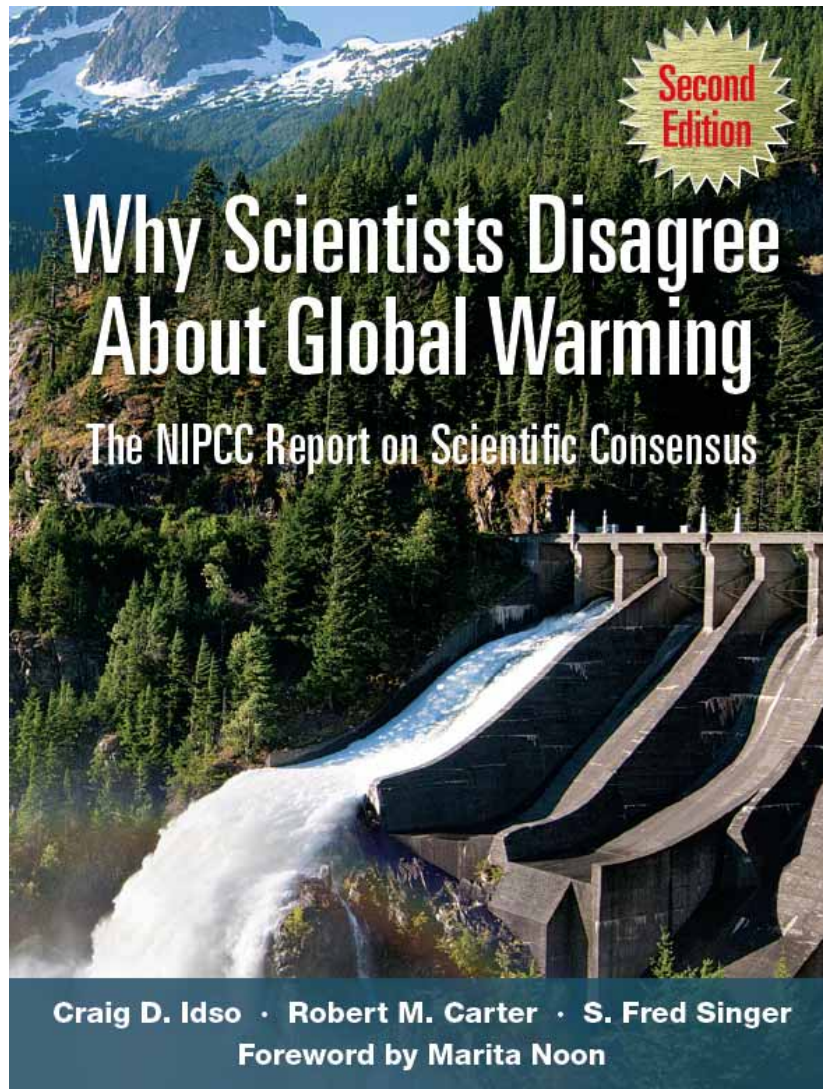

More than 4,000 pages with 20,000-plus citations from the scientific literature showing human activity is *not* causing a climate crisis.

No consensus



More than 350,000 copies sent in 2016 and 2017 to Fortune 500 CEOs, meteorologists, science teachers, college professors, reporters, editors, producers, hosts, and others who influence public opinion on global warming.

Extensive media attention and attendance of more than 4,000 people.

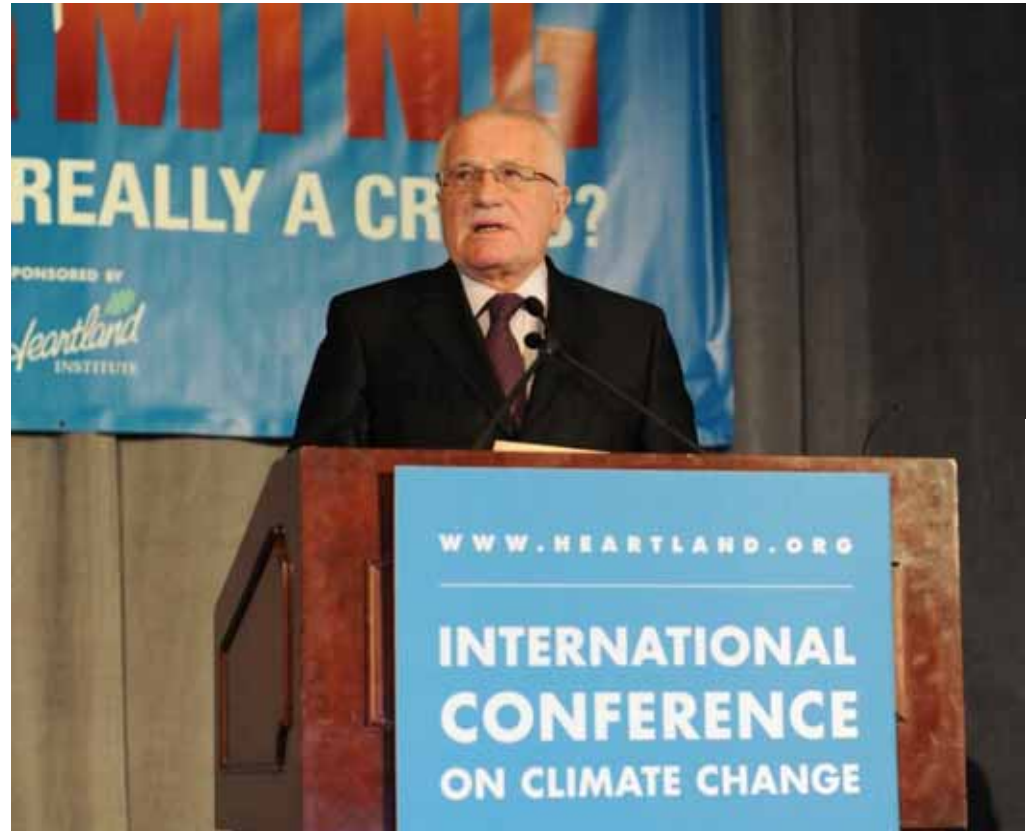
